#### **RULES & REGULATIONS**

- All livestock exhibits for competitions must be on the Show Grounds by 1130am on the day of the show
- No exhibit shall be removed before 5.00pm without an order from the Sec. Any person infringing this rule shall forfeit any prize they may have won
- 3. Horses for competition in the Show Jumping must be on site by 9.00am
- 4. All entries must be made either on printed form to the secretary or through www.banshashow.ie and completed in full with all required information. No entry will be accepted without full payment. Entry forms in all cases should be completed by the competitor or their agents. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date
- 5. The committee reserve the right to reject any entry
- Each exhibitor or agent must be prepared to verify any statement contained in the certificate of Entry
  in any manner the committee may require
- 7. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry
- Any objection of any sort must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within 1 week of the show, and is to be brought before the meeting of the show committee, except when the objection is as to the age or soundness of any animal, in which case the objection must be made in writing within 1 hour after the award of the judges and be decided (if possible) on the same day. No objection will be entertained by the committee unless a sum equal to 1 quarter of the amount claimed shall be lodged, which sum will be refunded if the objection is sustained, otherwise it will be forfeited
- Any exhibitor interfering with or disputing the judges decision shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to them together with all fees and deposits paid by them and to expulsion from the show grounds
- 10. In cases of any violation of the Rules and Regulations of the Society, false statement in the Certificate of Entry, or any practice calculated to deceive or mislead, the Exhibitor shall forfeit their entry fees and any prize awarded to them, and shall be liable to be prevented from competing at any future show of the Society
- 11. The Judges are invited to assemble on the morning of the show at 10.00am precisely and to proceed to decide upon the merits of the different animals without any inquiry as to the names of the persons or places, their awards being made in reference to the numbers which distinguish the different lots
- 12. Each set of Judges will be attended by a Steward who will have previously obtained from the Secretary a blank form of report for the different exhibits, to be filled up and signed, with the number of the successful lots written in ink
- 13. No Steward or other officer of the Society shall remain in the Ring acting as Steward whilst a class is being judged in which they are an Exhibitor or in which there is an exhibited animal in which directly or indirectly they have an interest in. A breach of this rule will entail forfeit of any prize or commendation which may be awarded to their exhibit
- 14. If less than 3 entries in the class the class can be cancelled
- 15. No pedigree animals to be judged against non-pedigree animals

Therefore, exhibitors should ensure that those in charge of stock are capable of handling them and they pose no danger to the exhibitor or the public.

Stock should be suitable trained and handled. Any loss or damage caused by the exhibitor will be the liability of the exhibitor or owner.

All exhibitors are required to have their own public liability insurance.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL ANIMAL OWNERS INVOLVED IN SHOWING ANIMALS

The Irish Shows Association would advise all animal owners who have their animals insured to have the insurance cover extended to cover them whilst showing their animals at shows. We understand that it costs very little or nothing at all depending on who you have insurance cover with.

If you are one of the few who don't have cover, we would advise that you think about putting it in place for this purpose; it may be well worthwhile.

The reason for us giving this advice is to protect yourself in the event of your animal lashing out and injuring someone or damaging someone's property. If that were to happen and it is established that your animal was out of your control, you may be held responsible, or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused and may end up paying all or part of any settlement reached.

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards Judges or other show officials
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine Judges or other officials before, during or following member shows
- Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions
- Abusing any animal

#### **Disciplinary Procedures:**

Complaints of misconduct against any Exhibitor or other participant at a member show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2025**

For the efficient running of the championships all concerned are requested to read and observe the rules set out below.

#### A. Eligibility of Shows

Shows wishing to participate in the 2025 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2024 and forwarded the amount collected, in full to the Irish Show Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable. Any show or competitor in breach of the rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these Championships. These general rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of participating shows and must be strictly observed.

#### B. Qualifying Rounds (Qualifiers)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association

#### C. Responsibility of Shows Holding Qualifying Rounds

- Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier which the highest placed animals will qualify
- The qualifier class, if possible, should be held as the first class in the relevant section of the show
- Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules
- No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes
- Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class
- No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that championship on the day of the final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association, however shows who hold qualifiers for Horses, Ponies
   & Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter in at least one other class at their show on the day
- Animals qualified for finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the show where the final is held other than a qualifying class for another competition
- Shows should appoint competent well briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals, or other exhibits, which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring

#### C. Responsibility of Show Holding Qualifying Rounds

- Animal passports should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show
- On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend the Show Secretary's office within 1 hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the Championship final
- The show must appoint a well briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's office and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee
- Show secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within 3 days following the holding of the show. Shows must return results cards marked 'No Competition' for any or all events for which no animal or exhibit has been selected

#### D. Responsibility of Exhibitors

- Exhibitors accept the judges decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises, the matter should only be dealt with under f. below
- Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals or exhibits for the final in accordance with j. and k. below within 1 hour of qualifying
- Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final
- The Irish Shows Association in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate
- Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championship and not the sponsor involved
- Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representatives at the show or the show secretary within 30 minutes following the completion of judging, together with a €50 fee or other stated fee which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld
- Any Exhibitor who makes a false declaration or misrepresents a fact regarding themselves or their exhibit is liable to disqualification and or forfeiture of any prizes awarded.
