BUI ES & REGUI ATIONS

- 1. All Livestock exhibits for competitions must be on the Show Grounds by 11.30 a.m. on the day of the Show.
- 2. No exhibit shall be removed before 5.00 p.m. without an order from the Sec. Any person infringing this Rule shall forfeit any prize he may have won.
- 3. Horses for competitions in Jumping Classes must be on grounds by 09.30 a.m.
- 4. All entries must be made with the Secretary, Bansha on printed form. No entry will be accepted unless the full amount of fees is paid. Entry Forms in all cases must be filled by the competitor or their agents. Entry Fees will not be refunded after closing date of entries.
- 5. The Certificate of Entries must be lodged with the Secretary at the time of entry and must specify:
 - (a) Classes in which the Animal or other Exhibit is to be placed;
 - (b) Name, residence, and post town of Exhibitor.
 - (c) Description of animal, viz. breed, colour, age:
- (d) In the case of pure-bred stock, the breeder's name and address, and Herd Book reference of pedigree so far as is required to qualify for entry In the Herd Book of the Breed; and also the precise date of birth.
- 6. No 1st Prize winner can compete in more than one Class for a Challenge Cup or Special Prize.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to reject any entry.
- 8. Each exhibitor or agent must be prepared to verify any statement contained in the Certificate of Entry in any manner the Committee may require.
- 9. All exhibits must be bona-fide property of Exhibitors at time of entry.
- 10 An objection of any sort must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary within 1 week of the Show date, and is to be brought before the next meeting of the Show Committee, except when the objection is as to the age or soundness of any animal, in which case the objection must be made in writing within one hour after the award of the Judges and be decided (if possible) on the same day. No objection will be entertained by the Committee unless a sum equal to one quarter of the amount claimed shall be lodged, which sum will be refunded if the objection is sustained, otherwise it will be forfeited.
- 11. Any exhibitor interfering with or disputing the Judges' decision shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to him (or her), together with all fees and deposits paid by him (or her) and to expulsion from the Show Grounds.
- 12. In cases of any violation of the Rules or Regulations of the Society, false statement in the Certificate of Entry, or any practice calculated to deceive or mislead, the Exhibitor shall forfeit his entry fees and any prize awarded to him, and shall be liable to be prevented from competing at any future Show of the Society.
- 13. The Judges are invited to assemble on the morning of the Show at 10.00 a.m. precisely, and to proceed to decide upon the merits of the different animals without any inquiry as to the names of persons or places, their awards being made in reference to the numbers which distinguish the different lots.
- 14. Each set of Judges will be attended by a Steward or Stewards, of the grounds, who will have previously obtained from the Secretary a blank form of report for the different exhibits, to be filled up and signed, with the number of the successful lots written in ink.
- 15. No steward or other officer of the Society shall remain in the Judging Ring acting as Steward while a class is being judged in which he is an exhibitor, or in which there is exhibited any animal in which, directly or indirectly, he is interested. A breach of this Rule will entail forfeiture of any prize or commendation which may be awarded to his exhibit.
- 16. Prizes: If less than three entries the Class can be cancelled, and no Third Prize unless there are at least five entries in the class.
- 17. No pedigree animals to be judged against non-pedigree animals.

- Abusing any Animal.

Disciplinary Procedures:

Complaints of misconduct against and Exhibitor or other participant at a member show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee.

The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural& constitutional justice.

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

A. ELIGIBILITY OF SHOWS

Shows wishing to participate in the 2023 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2022 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating shows and must be strictly observed.

B. QUALIFYING ROUNDS (QUALIFIERS)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association

C. RESPONSIBILITY OF SHOWS HOLDING QUALIFYING ROUNDS

- a. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- b. The qualifier class, if possible, should be held as the first (1st) class in the relevant section of the show.
- c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
- e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class.

The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful Qualifiers on appearance at the Final

f. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association. "However, Shows who hold qualifiers for Horses,

Ponies & Cattle may ask exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show on the day"

- g. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition
- h. Shows should appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- i. Animal Passports should be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.
- j. On completion of judging, Stewards should instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- k. The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
- 1. Show Secretaries <u>must</u> forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the Irish Shows Association within three (3) days following the holding of the show.

N.B. Shows must return results card marked "No Competition" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D RESPONSIBILITY OF EXHIBITORS
